- All students in the Respiratory Therapist program are part of the **Respiratory Therapy Club**, which provides opportunities for students to work together on studies and skills.
- **Leadership opportunities** are offered frequently, such as class officer positions, state society involvement, conference participation at the local and state levels, or classroom leadership.
- **Dr. John Kasik Memorial Scholarship:** Students who have completed the first semester of the RT program, achieved a grade point average of 2.0 or higher, and demonstrated leadership or community service can apply at www.kirkwood.edu/scholarships.

Program Description

Respiratory therapists, also known as respiratory care practitioners, provide treatment, evaluation, monitoring, and management of patients with breathing disorders or cardiovascular problems. Respiratory therapists administer oxygen, perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation, manage mechanical ventilators, administer medications, monitor cardiopulmonary systems, and measure lung function. Respiratory therapists treat all types of patients, including premature infants whose lungs have not fully developed, and elderly patients with chronic asthma or emphysema. They also provide emergency care for heart attack, stroke, drowning, or shock.

The Respiratory Therapist curriculum consists of classroom, laboratory, and hospital-based clinical experiences at area hospitals and in-home health.

This Allied Health program has a mandatory background check for clinical purposes.

Upon completion of the Respiratory Therapist program, you should have the skills and knowledge needed for board exams; TMC (Therapist Multiple Choice) exam (entry level), WRRT and/or CSE exam(s) (Registered Respiratory Therapist). Exams are administered by the National Board of Respiratory Care (NBRC). Listed exams are required for employment, along with licensure to practice respiratory therapy.
