# KIRKWOOD COMMUNITY COLLEGE Meeting of the Board of Trustees Thursday, June 13, 2024, 4:30 P.M. B.A. Jensen Board Room

#### **MINUTES**

Present: Steve Caves, Peggy Doerge, Alan Jensen, Jim Mollenhauer, Tracy Pearson, Keith Stamp, Lorraine Williams, and Leslie Wright.

Chair Mollenhauer called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

No public comments.

Trustees Williams and Caves moved and seconded approval of the nomination to appoint Casey J. Dunning to serve as Board Treasurer, effective June 13, 2024. Motion carried: 8-0.

Chair Mollenhauer administered the Oath of Office to Casey J. Dunning, newly appointed Board Treasurer.

Trustees Wright and Stamp moved and seconded approval of the minutes from the meeting held on May 9, 2024, and directed them to be made a part of the permanent record. Motion carried: 8-0.

Trustees Williams and Wright moved and seconded approval of the June 13, 2024 agenda. Motion carried: 8-0.

#### **INFORMATIONAL ITEMS**

#### **Kirkwood Report**

Justin Hoehn, Director of Media and Legislative Relations, provided the Eagle Update and Kirkwood report, which included:

- Kirkwood's commencement ceremony was held on Saturday, May 11, 2024, at the Alliant Energy PowerHouse, with nearly 600 graduates participating.
- The Kirkwood Eagles' softball team competed as the sixth seed in the NJCAA DII Softball World Series in Spartanburg, South Carolina, finishing as national runners-up to St. John's River State. This second-place finish was the best for Kirkwood in 40 years. Freshmen Brenna Ross, Kiya Johnson, and Peyton Driscoll were named to the All-Tournament Team, while Rachael Schlotter received post-season national awards.
- The Kirkwood Eagles' golf team finished as national runners-up to Mississippi Gulf Coast, trailing by only three strokes. Grant Greazel won an individual national title with a 3-under-par score and was also honored as a 2024 Jack Nicklaus Award winner.
- Kirkwood Athletics had one of its best seasons in history, with four out of six sports teams ranking among the top in the nation.
- Hailey Harbison, Brighton, Iowa, is student of the month. She is studying Ag Science and beef
  production at Kirkwood. Hailey values the hands-on instruction and abundant learning experiences. She
  aims to own a successful business specializing in livestock ultrasounds and expanding her client base in
  artificial insemination.

- The Department of Education has approved a new Visual Arts Associate of Applied Arts program. This program will prepare students for transfer to a four-year college or university art programs or for entry-level employment in the visual arts field.
- The Social Sciences department signed its first articulation agreement with the University of Northern lowa. This agreement allows Kirkwood graduates with an Associate of Applied Science degree in Early Childhood Education to transfer into UNI's Early Childhood Education Program as third-year students.
- The Criminal Justice and Human Services departments hosted their first annual career fair, providing students with the opportunity to explore potential job prospects and network with professionals in their fields.
- A group of culinary faculty and students recently returned from a 12-day trip to Japan, where they explored culture and food techniques. They visited GK Jikei and learned from Japanese chef instructors. Chef Mike Barshis extended his stay in Tokyo to spend a week learning from a master noodle maker to apply these skills in the classroom.

### **Financial Report**

Treasurer Dunning provided a high-level review of changes to the FY24 projected revenues for operating Fund 1 at the June 2024 board meeting for the period of July 2023 thru April 2024. Thru April 2024, credit tuition is exceeding budget by \$2.49M and contract training & non-credit tuition (less refunds) is exceeding budget by \$326K. Investment income is exceeding budget by \$380k due to higher than expected interest rates.

Overall, actual revenue is projected to exceed budget revenue by \$3.38M; however, we still have two months remaining in fiscal year 2024, so projections can change based on actual activity in future months.

Overall expenses for operating Fund 1 are projected to remain within budget for FY24. Key expense savings include Salaries and Benefits savings of \$2.81M due to savings from unfilled open positions. Additional savings are projected from utilities expenses of \$246K.

Fund 3 is projected to end the year with a net income of \$99k. This falls short budgeted net income by \$471k, but this could change over the final two months of the year due to volatility in the predictability of enterprise operations.

Cash balances remain strong with the College having 151 days of unrestricted days reserve at the end of May 2024, when compared to a KPI of 75 days.

Dunning also provided an update on credit tuition rates for AY2024-25 including a comparison of rates for all community colleges.
