## KIRKWOOD COMMUNITY COLLEGE Meeting of the Board of Trustees Thursday, July 16, 2024, 4:30 P.M. B.A. Jensen Board Room

#### MINUTES

Chair Mollenhauer called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

No public comments.

Trustees Thys and Stamp moved and seconded approval of the appointment of Doug Bannon to serve as District VII Director, effective October 11, 2024, for the duration of the current term set to expire November 2025. Motion carried: 9-0.

Trustees Williams and Caves moved and seconded approval of the minutes from the meeting held on June 13, 2024, and directed them to be made a part of the permanent record. Motion carried: 9-0.

Trustees Wright and Stamp moved and seconded approval of the July 16, 2024 agenda. Motion carried: 9-0.

## **INFORMATIONAL ITEMS**

#### **Kirkwood Report**

Justin Hoehn, Director of Media Relations and Communications, provided the Kirkwood report, which included:

- Summer is off to a great start with the Kirkwood KICK [Kirkwood Interactive Camps for Kids] Camps. KICK camps are designed around career exploration and provide fun, hands-on activities that promise to develop and build key skills for future success. Some of the popular camps include Paint Your World, Teen Mechanic, and All the Small Things camps. A full list of camps can be found on Kirkwood.edu.
- Kirkwood's Horticulture interns have been crafting floral arrangements each week using native and perennial plants sourced right on campus. They're also planting and nurturing annuals across college grounds, maintaining our greenhouse as well as researching a new hydroponic system.
- On June 20, the college hosted the Presidential Networking Reception in Iowa Hall. The event showcased the college's many services, solutions, and programs that significantly impact our region's workforce. Community and business leaders were invited to attend.
- On Friday, June 14, over 100 former Kirkwood Student Ambassadors gathered on the main campus for the inaugural Student Ambassador Reunion. This event provided an opportunity for many former ambassadors to reconnect and catch up. One former ambassador issued a challenge to their fellow alumni, pledging to match gifts up to \$2,500 in support of the Kirkwood Alumni Scholarship. - A new Herky statue, named "Herky Laureate," now stands in front of the Kirkwood Regional Center at the University of Iowa. Part of Iowa's 100 Herky On Parade statues, it was unveiled a few weeks ago. This statute honors Iowa City's rich literary history and the Iowa Writer's Workshop.
- Last month, the Ag Sciences department hosted over 600 people for State FFA Floriculture, State FFA Horse, State FFA Nursery Landscape, and District FFA Livestock.

- Last month the Ag Sciences department also hosted its annual Ag/Hospitality Day, where high school students from across the region and beyond to explore college Ag facilities and The Hotel at Kirkwood Center.
- New student orientations have been taking place on campus, and our Admissions department is actively engaged in various recruiting activities, including hosting visit days for prospective students.
- Kirkwood was recently featured in the Gazette as part of a week-long piece called Company Spotlight. The college was one of five area businesses and organizations featured by the newspaper. The article talked about the college's culture, professional development opportunities, the work-life balance, community engagement, innovation, and why people enjoy working at Kirkwood.
- A preview of the advertisement that will air during the Olympic coverage of the upcoming Summer Games in Paris was also showcased.

## **Summer Enrollment**

Becky Weininger, Research Analyst, reported on the current enrollment for the summer 2024 term based on the weekly enrollment report she prepared on July 8, 2024.

Summer 2024 enrollment is 4,338 students up 10.1% and enrolled in 24,403 credit hours, up 8.3% over 2023. Both College Credit in High School and Regular enrolled students have increased, and the majority of the increase in credit hours is due to regular credit hours being up.

The summer term enrollment has helped our preliminary AY 23-24 overall headcount to be at 16,948 up 2.2% over 2023. The numbers will be finalized in September.

Fall 2024 enrollment update was also provided. Fall enrollment continues to run ahead of the pace set for Fall 2023 by 3.5% for credit hours. While this is a positive sign, orientations started earlier for new students in 2024 and we expect the enrollment for fall new students to flatten as we move through July.

## **Financial Report**

Treasurer Dunning provided a review of the Fiscal Year 2025 Operating Budget. The operating budget consists of Fund 1 (day-to-day operations of the College) and Fund 3 the College's auxiliary funds (Hotel, Bookstore, Farm, Iowa Equestrian Center, Fleet, NJTP, Fund-raising, student clubs, etc.).

## Fund 1:

FY24 operating revenue budget is \$99.5M, which is an overall increase in revenue of \$5.1M when compared to the FY24 Budget. Credit tuition is increasing \$3.6M with assumed flat credit hours year over year. State funding is increasing \$546K, investment income is decreasing \$200K, and Foundation investment revenue is increasing \$300K.

FY25 expense budget is \$99.5M, which is an overall increase in expense of \$4.5M when compared to the FY24 Budget. Salaries and benefits are increasing \$2.2M, Operating expenses are increasing \$1.6M, and Non-operating expenses are increasing \$600K.

Overall Fund 1 budget is balanced with revenues equal to expenditures for FY25.

## Fund 3:

FY25 operating revenue budget is \$15.5M, which is an overall decrease in revenue of \$1.1M when compared to the FY24 Budget. This decrease is largely driven by the NJTP (260E) Admin fund accounts being relocated in FY25 from Fund 3 to Fund 22.

FY25 expense budget is \$15.5M, which is an overall decrease in expense of \$565K when compared to the FY24 Budget. Salaries and benefits are decreasing \$1.3M, Operating expenses are increasing \$126K, and Non-operating expenses are increasing \$615K. The decrease in salaries and benefits are attributed to the NJTP (260E) Admin funds accounts being relocated in FY25 from Fund 3 to Fund 22.

Overall Fund 3 budget is balanced with revenues equal to expenditures for FY25.

## FY24 Actuals:

Treasurer Dunning provided a high-level review of changes to the FY24 projected revenues for operating Fund 1 at the July 2024 board meeting for the period of July 2023 thru May 2024. Through May 2024, credit tuition is exceeding budget by \$2.46M and contract training & non-credit tuition (less refunds) is exceeding budget by \$326K. Investment income is exceeding budget by \$248k due to higher than expected interest rates. Overall, actual revenue is projected to exceed budget revenue by \$2.92M.

Overall expenses for operating Fund 1 are projected to remain within budget for FY24. Key expense savings include Salaries and Benefits savings of \$2.97M due to savings from unfilled open positions. Additional savings are projected from utilities expenses of \$354K, other expenses of \$603K, travel of \$152K, media of \$150K, and non-capital equipment of \$183K.

Fund 3 is projected to end the year with a net loss of \$10k. This falls short budgeted net income by \$581k and will be covered via a transfer from Fund 1 net income.

Cash balances remain strong with the College having 136 days of unrestricted days reserve at the end of June 2024, when compared to a KPI of 75 days.
