MINUTES

Chair Pearson called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

No public comments.

Chair Pearson declared the public hearing open at 4:31 p.m., regarding the amended budget for Fiscal Year 2025-2026 and noted that approval of the amended FY26 budget would occur under New Business later in the meeting. Hearing no questions or comments, Trustees Thys and Caves moved and seconded to close the public hearing at 4:31 p.m. Motion carried: 8-0.

Recognition – Coach Kim Muhl

Tracy Pearson, Board Chair, honored Coach Kim Muhl during the May 14, 2026, Board of Trustees meeting in recognition of his retirement, outstanding success, and dedicated service to Kirkwood. Coach Muhl was acknowledged for his distinguished career and the lasting impact he has made on student-athletes and the institution. Chair Pearson offered a heartfelt tribute highlighting his leadership, commitment, and contributions to Kirkwood’s athletic programs.

Student Perspectives

Melissa Payne, Vice President-Student Services, introduced recent graduate Gracyn Kane. Gracyn is a Liberal Arts student from Coggon, Iowa who shared a story of involvement and success at Kirkwood. She shared how her engagement with activities and support services have contributed to her future goals. Gracyn graduated last weekend and will be serving as a Peer Orientation Leader this summer.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

Kirkwood Report

Justin Hoehn, Director of Media Relations and Communications, provided the Kirkwood report, which included:

- Summer Franck, apparel Merchandising and Design student, has been named May Student of the Month.
- The college recently announced the addition of the Business Analytics Technician program, along with the National Academy of Sports Medicine Certified Personal Trainer credential within the Exercise Science program.
- Kirkwood Dean of Global Learning, Dawn Wood, has been recognized with the 2026 Peter A. Wollitzer Advocacy Award.
- Kirkwood recently announced the hiring of Nate Oakland as the next head coach of the women’s basketball program.

- This past weekend, 776 graduates participated in Commencement, celebrating this milestone alongside more than 7,000 family members and friends in attendance.

Legislative Update

Jasmine Almoayyed, Vice President-Government & Community Relations, provided an update on the high-level projected impacts of this session's legislative changes on future budgets. The presentation specifically highlighted the impact of property tax changes on fixed-rate levies, the 260E New Jobs Training Program, Accelerated Career Education (ACE) infrastructure funding, and Adult Basic Education.

A comprehensive legislative report is being compiled by Community Colleges for Iowa and will be published in the coming weeks. Once available, this report will be shared with the Board, along with Kirkwood-specific context and analysis for each legislative change.

Kirkwood Strategic Plan, Academic Year 2026-2029

Megan Thole, Senior Director-Institutional Effectiveness, provided an overview of Kirkwood's Strategic Plan for Academic Year 2026-2029. In May 2025, the Board approved the college's updated mission statement and core values as part of Kirkwood's ongoing strategic planning process and commitment to institutional effectiveness. Building on that foundation, the proposed Strategic Focus Areas for the college's next strategic plan were reviewed during the informational session, along with the college's institutional key performance indicators [KPIs]. Collectively, these priorities reflect the college's long-term vision, strategic direction, and continued commitment to student and institutional success.

Financial Report

Treasurer Dunning provided a high-level review of changes to the FY26 projected revenues for operating Fund 1 at the May 2026 Board meeting for the period of July 2025 through March 2026. Through January 2026, credit tuition is projected to exceed budget by \$1.44M. Investment income is projected to exceed budget by \$1.11M due to higher-than-expected interest rates. Overall, actual revenue is projected to exceed budget revenue by \$2.72M.

Overall expenses for operating Fund 1 are projected to remain within budget for FY26. Key expense savings include Salaries and Benefits savings of \$2.52M due to savings from unfilled open positions. Operating Expenses are projected to end the year within budget in aggregate. Overspends in categories are adequately covered through savings in other categories. Overall Operating Expenses are projected to provide savings of \$820K compared to budget.

Fund 1 net income is projected to be \$3.75M due to the combination of better-than-exchange revenues and savings in payroll and operating expenses. Fund 3 net income is projected to end the year in line with budget.

Cash balances remain strong with the College having 182 days of unrestricted days reserve at the end of April 2026, when compared to a KPI of 90 days.

Administration

Trustees Stamp and Jensen moved and seconded the approval of the strategic plan focus areas for the college's next institutional strategic plan, as presented. Motion carried: 8-0.

Trustees Wright and Bannon moved and seconded the approval of the FY2026 Budget Amendment. The amendment increases the expense budget for the College's General Funds by \$4M and Plant Funds by \$3M. Motion carried: 8-0

Trustees Stamp and Doerge moved and seconded approval of directing the sale and authorizing the issuance of \$5,525,000.00 taxable Industrial New Jobs Training Certificates. This measure provides for the securing of such certificates for the purpose of carrying out New Jobs Training Programs. Motion carried: 8-0.

Trustees Caves and Jensen moved and seconded the acceptance of the proposal and directed the sale of Industrial New Jobs Training Certificates in the aggregate principal amount of \$5,525,000.00. Motion carried: 8-0

Trustees Bannon and Wright moved and seconded the approval of the preliminary Industrial New Jobs Training Agreements [260E] with the following:

1. Fosters Kraus Mechanical Group, Inc., Hiawatha, IA

Motion carried: 8-0.

Trustees Thys and Wright moved and seconded the approval of Larson Construction Company, Inc., as the Construction Manager at Risk for the interior remodel of Kirkwood East Hall, with a fee of 4.5% for overhead and profit and a \$5,000 preconstruction fee. Motion carried: 8-0.

President's Report

- Kirkwood's commencement was held on Saturday, May 9th, at the Alliant Energy PowerHouse. The event celebrated one of the largest graduating classes in recent history with 776 students crossing the

stage. President Fisher expressed her sincere appreciation to all who attended and helped make the day such a meaningful celebration for our graduates and their families.

- Casey Dunning and President Fisher participated in the Iowa State Board of Education's Budget approval process.
- Earlier this week, Kirkwood met with the Cedar Rapids Community School District for a K-12 Partnership Information and Planning Retreat.
- The Kirkwood Eagles Athletic teams continue to achieve success at a high level. The softball team will travel to Spartanburg, SC to participate in the 2026 NJCAA Division II Softball World Series. The baseball team is awaiting notification on a potential at-large bid to the NJCAA Division II World Series, and the golf team will travel to Plymouth, IN to compete in the NJCAA Division II Men's Golf Championships with hopes of earning a national title.
