Degree-seeking students will specialize in network infrastructure, which includes wireless, server, and desktop operating systems, as well as security best practices for all aspects of the network and system administration. In addition to training for the technical specialization, the coursework focuses on communication skills, professionalism, critical thinking and problem-solving, basic legal aspects of technology along with governance, risk and compliance, and teamwork and lifelong learning. Through the term 4 capstone project, students will have the opportunity to demonstrate to industry partners what they have been learning. These partners are potential hiring companies for graduates emerging from the NaSA program.
