- Paramedic students are able to perform as they would when employed in a **hospital setting**.
- **Personal computer tablets** are utilized in the classroom and lab/clinical setting to acclimate the students to the profession.
- In the course of study, students gain membership to the **National Association of EMTs**.

Program Description

Paramedics provide the highest level of pre-hospital emergency care. They are allied health professionals whose primary focus is to provide advanced emergency medical care for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical system.

Students will learn to utilize critical thinking skills while simulating rapid assessment, treatment and stabilization of injured or ill patients. Class size is generally 15–25 students and incorporates extensive field training and clinical experience. Students not only gain necessary skills in the real environment, but also have the ability to gain connections for potential future employment.
